Jo Marie Reilly, M.D. is an Associate Professor of Family Medicine at the Keck School of Medicine of USC (KSOM). She is the Co-director of the Primary Care Community Medicine Project, Assistant Director of the Introduction to Clinical Medicine Course and past director of the Professionalism and the Practice of Medicine course at USC. She graduated from Georgetown Medical School, completed her internship and residency in family medicine at the Kaiser Permanente Family Residency Program in Los Angeles. She completed a fellowship in women's health and obstetrics at the White Memorial Family Practice Residency Program where she remained as faculty for 13 years. She is the chair of the Student and Resident Affairs Committee for the California Academy of Family Physicians, KSOM student Family Medicine Interest Group advisor and former co-chair of STFM's bioethics and humanities interest group. She is part of several editorial boards to include PULSE and Family Medicine. Dr. Reilly's publications and research interests include innovations in student and resident education, physician well-being, care for the underserved, arts, humanities and narrative medicine and women and children's health care.

FELIX L. NUÑEZ, M.D., M.P.H.

Felix L. Nuñez, M.D., M.P.H. is a board certified Family Physician who serves as the interim Chief Executive Officer and Chief Medical Officer of the Family Health Care Centers of Greater Los Angeles (FHCCGLA), and Clinical Assistant Professor of Family Medicine for the Keck/USC School of Medicine. He currently serves on the Advisory Board of the Keck School of Medicine Primary Care Community Medicine Program. Prior to joining FHCCGLA he was VP of Clinical Services for the Community Clinic Association of Los Angeles County. His past experience includes serving as the Medical Director of The South Central Family Health Center, an Assistant Medical Director with the Los Angeles County Department of Health Services, and an Assistant Clinical Instructor with the Harbor-UCLA Family Medicine Residency Program. He earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Biology from Loyola Marymount University in 1991, his Doctor of Medicine degree from Harvard Medical School in 1995, and

Master of Public Health degree from the UCLA School of Public Health in 2001. In 1998 he completed a residency in Family Medicine at the Harbor-UCLA Medical Center and in 2005 was a fellow in the Primary Health Care Policy Fellowship of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. He is a member of the Los Angeles County Medical Association, the California Medical Association, the American Academy of Family Physicians, the Association of Clinicians for the Underserved, Physicians for Social Responsibility, and the Massachusetts Medical Society. In addition he is on the Board of Directors of the Loyola Marymount Mexican American Alumni Association. He is the past Chairman of the Clinical Advisory Group of the Community Clinic Association of Los Angeles County and is Chairman of the Advocacy Committee of the Association of Clinicians for the Underserved. Dr. Nuñez is a native Angeleno who was raised in El Sereno, a Latino community in Northeast Los Angeles.

G. MICHAEL ROYBAL, M.D., M.P.H.

Born in and raised in New Mexico, G. Michael Roybal, M.D., M.P.H. attended Harvard College where he graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Engineering Science. He next attended the University of Southern California School of Medicine in Los Angeles, California. After completing his training in Internal Medicine at the University of California, San Francisco, Dr. Roybal pursued and received a Master of Public Health degree in Health Services from the University of California, Los Angeles School of Public Health.

Currently, Dr. Roybal is the Medical Director of the Edward R. Roybal Comprehensive Health Center and a member of the Board of Governors of the LA Care Health Plan. Dr. Roybal has focused his efforts in health care delivery as it pertains to patients with chronic illness and, as the Co-Chair of the Los Angeles County Department of Health Service's Disease Management Oversight Team, he has been actively involved in the planning, implementation, and support of its chronic disease management program. KIMBERLY UYEDA, M.D., M.P.H.

Kimberly Uyeda, M.D., M.P.H. is the Director of Student Medical Services and Community Partnerships/Medi-Cal Programs for the Los Angeles Unified School District. Her work in the District focuses on service delivery to underserved populations through innovative school-community partnerships. The District has entered into a number of collaborative efforts to provide school-based or school-linked health services to over 100,000 students annually. Dr. Uyeda oversees health providers (doctors, nurses, optometrists) who provide direct medical services, such as school entry exams, immunizations, assessment for special education, and other types of specialty care (asthma, obesity, and vision problems). She has worked to engage school district personnel in addressing nutrition, physical activity, and a healthy school environment by speaking at professional development forums and working on taskforces at the county and district level. Dr. Uyeda serves as the principal investigator of the Merck Childhood Asthma Network-sponsored asthma program in LAUSD, and is co-investigator on the UCLA/RAND Healthy Adolescent Living Study focused on obesity prevention in middle school students. She is an Assistant Clinical Professor in the Department of Pediatrics at UCLA. She completed a fellowship and earned her masters degree in Community Health Sciences at the UCLA School of Public Health. She is a practicing pediatrician, having completed her residency training at Cedars Sinai Medical Center and medical school at the University of California, San Diego.
